
The results for student council polls were declared on Monday 13th June.

dent. She explained every concept in detail and also taught us using some examples. Overall, the session was excellent!!! We all loved this session and we hope to benefit from this session forever. When the session ended, we were thorough with all the concepts and the students were also interacting with the teacher and asking their doubts. I would like to end this speech by hoping that Lecole Chempaka will go on with such sessions and make plans for such activities. I am grateful to the management for this.



"Safe Campus" is an organization made up of a group of people whose aim is to empower young children to fight against physical or mental abuse. On August 5th 2022, a consultant Shri.Abhay, from "Safe Campus" came to our school to teach us about the methods to tackle physical and mental abuse. He said that we must first of all have self-confidence and should be aware of situations that put us in danger. We must be conscious of the intentions and motives of people around us and should be able to distinguish the good from the evil and should not get involved in bad friendships which can do us harm.

If someone tries to harm us physically, we shouldn't cry for help nor start a fight with them. Instead we must move back and shout the word-"STOP".It means that we aren't scared or intimidated.

Mental abuse includes behaviour like blackmailing, insulting and verbal abuse which can cause mental stress and harm. In case of mental abuse, we must discuss about it with our parents or seek counselling from experts. The session was very informative and we learnt many techniques to keep ourselves mentally and physically safe.



DOCTOR'S DAY SPECIAL ASSEMBLY BY GRADE V PERIWINKLE



National Doctors' Day celebrations in India began in 1991 on July 1 to honour Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy, or B.C. Roy, whose birth and death anniversary, both fall on July 1. B.C. They possess global operations across 5 continents. He says that the secret of their success story is because the company follows three main values, namely

- 1) Humility being humble
- 2) Humanity looking at the less privileged
- 3) Integrity being honest

G.A Menon, (b.1931-d.2003) the founder chairman of the company, is an important personality who helped UST to reach its peak. He brought up the three main values of the company.

Mr. Sthanu Thambi concluded his speech by giving the messages of hardworking and smart working. We got a chance to clarify our doubts regarding technology. The question-and-answer session was followed by a small video presentation about UST.



We got down through the lifts back to the ground floor. An employee explained that different floors are colored according to the different spices, and each floor is a particular department. As we passed the gateway, we saw a giant snake boat positioned neatly. He expressed that it was the real "Chambakulam Chundan Vallam", which had been the title winner 9 times. We then walked downstairs towards the lake, where he told that the lake was man-made. We got out of the building, where we saw a herd of swans near the lake, swimming and spreading their large wings, exhibiting its elegant



visual appearance. They warned us to not go near them as they might attack us. We watched them from afar. We clicked many pictures with the teachers and employees. Some of us collected the swan feathers lying on the ground because they appeared beautiful. We then left the campus at 10:45 am and headed towards our school.

On Wednesday 10th August we were taken from school for a field trip to ICAR-CTCRI (Central Tuber Crops Research Institute), which is a constituent Institute under Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR)

is the only research organization in the world dedicated solely to the research on Topical Tuber crops. The institute was established in 1963 with its head-quarters at Trivandrum Kerala. We had gone to the headquarters of ICAR-CTCRI in Sreekaryam which is 12 kilometers away from the city. We reached the center at about 10;30 am. Firstly we were taken to the Crop Protection division were a senior scientist explained to us how the Bio pesticides are made out of tapioca leaves and also how to use it.

Secondly we were taken to the section of Extension and Social Sciences were we saw how technology was used in farming for example drones were used to observe the plants . Another interesting machine was, based on the weather it sends SMS to farmer's phone and alerts them as to which nutrients are needed and how much is needed.

We had a quick snack break and went on to know more about CTCRI, the scientist explained to us about tuber crops and the products made from it. CTCRI has a vast AREA almost about 20 hectares. We kids loved the place and also felt proud at the kind of researches that is happening in our home town. Towards the end of the visit, we watched a video about Tuber Crops. Must say the visit to CTCRI was very informative. If not for this field trip, I wouldn't have known about this research center. In an era where we give very less importance to agriculture, such centre is an eye opener on how we can help farmers with technology and research. It was a great trip and I express my heartfelt thanks to the teachers and school management.

CENTRAL TUBER CROPS RESEARCH INSTITUTE

CTCRI is Under ICAR (Indian Council of Agricultural Research). CTCRI was established in July 1963, and it has 21 Sectors. It is inSreekaryam, Thiruvananthapuram. The campus covers an area of 48.19 hectares.

We boarded the bus at 9:00 am. The boys were seated in the back, and on the way, we sang a lot of songs together. It was about 9:30 am when we arrived at the research institute. Each of us received an identification number. First, an officer gave us information about biopesticides. Two gigantic machines stood there. We then saw an E-crop. An E-Crop can detect if a particular nutrient is needed more. It can be connected to a phone, and it will keep updating. It can locate all plants within a radius of five kilometres. We also saw a drone that was used to check on the plants.

Then we had a break and ate some snacks. After our break, an officer explained about Yams. There were 3 kinds of yams. White yams, bigger yams, and smaller ones. After that, we learned about Chinese potatoes. A new variety of Chinese potato was introduced in 1993 called SREE DHARA, which contains between 16% and 20% starch.

We saw a machine that extracts cassava. The machine offers storage for peeled tubing. Rasper blades can be easily removed. The machine is easy to transport, operate, and maintain.

Then we went to a multipurpose hall where an officer showed us a video. We learned about different types of tube crops. Tube crops are also known as "life-saving crops" because they contain carbohydrate and mineral compounds.

The 'TARO' is rich in calcium, iron, phosphorus and vitamins A and C.

We had our lunch. Facilitators called us again using our identification numbers, and we got back on the bus with a lot of new information. The trip was a great experience for us in Grade 6.


